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The 2011 Oregon Healthy Teens: Brookings-Harbor School District 17C Profile Report

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1. Introduction

The Oregon Healthy Teens (OHT) survey is Oregon's historical and on-going method to monitor the health and well-being of middle and high school aged adolescents. The OHT is a voluntary and anonymous survey of 8th and 11th graders, most recently conducted in academic year 2010-2011. The survey results summarized in this report were obtained from February to May 2011.

This report is designed to give schools and communities information about how well their young people are doing. The OHT indicates whether youth are developing health compromising, anti-social or other forms of behavior that could be quite costly to them and those around them.

OHT results are used by schools, state and local agencies, organizations and communities to identify health risks and to plan ways to help prevent risky behavior and promote healthy behavior. Schools can improve the health of their students by promoting programs that provide students with the knowledge and skills to support positive health behaviors. The OHT Survey provides a wealth of data for local school and community program planning, implementation and evaluation.

In addition, OHT statistics serve as valuable tools for legislators and other policy makers as they make decisions about health-related policies, services, programs, and educational activities. Laws targeting injury prevention and unnecessary deaths along with resource allocation for health priorities are informed by the OHT. Monitoring of student health improves the ability to procure health-related funding by providing baseline data that are required for grant writing. Many schools and communities use the findings to obtain grant funding to enhance local prevention efforts.

The data are also used to report state and national leading health indicators included in the Oregon Benchmarks¹ and Healthy People 2020². Extremely important in understanding youth behavioral trends over time, the OHT reports date back to 1997³.

The Oregon Health Authority contracted with the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center (WYSAC) at the University of Wyoming, to provide personnel, labor, equipment, materials and supplies necessary to recruit and train schools for online and paper-and-pencil survey administration. An OHT web page was created that included⁴:

- Training on survey administration for schools;
- Browser compatibility checks;
- All OHT materials: copies of surveys, letters to schools, parental consent forms, FAQs; and
- Online test login.

WYSAC created the OHT datasets and prepared the statewide report along with reports for each participating district and school.

1.1. Overview of the OHT

The Oregon Healthy Teens (OHT) survey gathers anonymous self-reported information on student behavior with regard to:

- Tobacco, alcohol and other drug use;
- Access to tobacco and alcohol;
- Personal safety behaviors and perceptions;
- Violence-related behaviors;
- Diet and exercise;
- Extracurricular activities;
- Sexual activity and birth control procedures;
- Health conditions and access to care; and
- Individual, peer, community and family influences on risk behaviors.

1.1.1. Evidence-Based Practices

OHT Survey results are used by schools, state and local agencies, organizations and communities to identify youth health risks and to plan ways to prevent risky behavior and promote healthy behavior. Schools can improve the health of their students by implementing programs that provide students with knowledge and skills to support positive health behaviors.

While OHT results can help schools identify areas in need of improvement, the data cannot explain why a problem exists or how it can be prevented or addressed. The challenge lies in implementing evidence-based programs to support healthy and productive learning environments.

It is vital to implement strategies, interventions, and programs for which there is scientific evidence showing they consistently improve outcomes. Free tools such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's School Health Index⁵ and the Alliance for a Healthier Generation's Healthy School Builder⁶ complement OHT findings. These tools are self-assessment and planning tools that foster communication and present effective practices that address health-related barriers to learning. Both tools have a focus on physical activity and nutrition. The School Health Index also includes information on safety, asthma, and tobacco.

2. Methods

2.1. Questionnaires

The Oregon Healthy Teens surveys are a collaborative project of the Oregon Health Authority, Oregon Department of Education, Oregon Commission on Children and Families, and the Criminal Justice Commission. Questions, concerns, and comments are invited. For technical assistance, please contact the Oregon Health Authority Center for Health Statistics.

An abbreviated version of the 11th grade questionnaire, which omitted some of the more sensitive questions, was administered to 8th grade students. Nine questions were omitted, and are listed below:

- During the past 30 days, did you vomit or take laxatives to lose weight or to keep from gaining weight?
- During the past 30 days, how many times did you drive a car or other vehicle when you had been drinking alcohol?
- Which of the following best describes you? (Heterosexual, gay, lesbian, bisexual)
- During your life, with whom have you had sexual contact? (Females, males, both)
- Have you ever been physically forced to have sexual intercourse when you did not want to?
- Have you ever given in to sexual activity when you didn't want to because of pressure?
- During your life, has any adult ever had sexual contact with you?
- During the past 12 months, did your boyfriend or girlfriend ever hit, slap, or physically hurt you on purpose?
- During your life, has any adult ever intentionally hit or physically hurt you?

An online and paper-and-pencil version of the 8th and 11th grade surveys were produced. The online version of the questionnaires included forced “skip patterns.” For example, a student who indicated never having had sexual intercourse would not view inapplicable onscreen follow-up questions regarding sexual intercourse.

The questionnaires were translated into Spanish. By default, English questionnaires were sent to schools, but all were offered copies of Spanish translations. Additionally, the Spanish questionnaires were easily accessible to download and print from the OHT website.

2.2. Survey Participants

The OHT was designed to be administered to students in 8th and 11th grades in selected Oregon public schools. Occasionally, students in other grades completed the survey but these students' data were not included in any statewide, district, or school statistics. A comparison between participants' demographic information for the statewide estimates and Brookings-Harbor School District 17C are provided in the results section.

2.3. School Selection

The Oregon Health Authority was responsible for school selection. There were three ways schools could participate in the survey:

- 1) As part of a statewide sample (systematic random sample implicitly stratified by enrollment size);
- 2) At the request of the Healthy Kids Learn Better (HKLB) or School-Based Health Centers (SBHC) programs; or
- 3) As a volunteer school paying to participate.

2.3.1. Sampling Plan

The goal of the overall sampling was to obtain a statewide sample of 8th and 11th grade students and maximize the usefulness of the survey to the schools. For a representative sample of 8th and 11th grade students attending Oregon public schools, 34 high schools and their associated “feeder” middle schools were randomly selected. Selection of middle schools was based on the “school cluster” concept focusing on 8th grade students attending middle schools from which they would likely matriculate to the sample high school within the same district.

2.4. Survey Administration

School districts and schools that were selected either as part of the sample or had been identified as potentially willing to volunteer and pay-to-participate were contacted directly by professional staff at WYSAC regarding participation. If a school district and district school agreed to participate, a test date was set and survey materials were sent directly to the school. All schools received paper and electronic copies of a parental consent form, in both English and Spanish, to distribute to parents or guardians, as well as a hard copy of the questionnaire to be kept on the school premises for parents and guardians to review. For schools electing to use paper questionnaires, one survey packet for each participating classroom was prepared. This survey packet contained questionnaires equal to the number of students plus a few extras, pre-sharpened pencils, a set of instructions, and a collection envelope. For schools choosing the online survey, packets contained only administration instructions and classroom login codes.

Schools were in charge of distributing passive parental consents forms, and were encouraged to send consent forms to students’ homes at least two weeks prior to the survey administration date. Most often, teachers gave students the consent forms to take home or distributed the consent forms through school newsletters or along with term grades mailed directly to the parents. All participating schools used passive parental consent, meaning that parents could signify non-consent by simply returning a signed form to the school, resulting in their child being opted out of the participation pool.

In most schools, classroom teachers administered the survey in their classrooms. Teachers informed students via oral instructions that participation was voluntary and anonymous. Students not participating received another activity to complete, such as independent reading or studying. To ensure anonymity, teachers were instructed to inform students not to write their names or any other identifying marks on the survey questionnaire. Students responded to the survey questions by marking their answers directly on the questionnaire or marking their answers on the internet website. For students using paper surveys, questionnaires were put into a common classroom collection envelope, which teachers sealed immediately and mailed to WYSAC for analysis.

2.5. Data Preparation and Analysis

Received completed questionnaires were cataloged, tracked by point of origin, and prepared for scanning. Mutilated, torn, or otherwise unusable questionnaires were set aside and handled separately. Trained research assistants scanned surveys using Teleform 10.2 software, or in the case of damaged surveys entered the data manually. Each questionnaire was verified individually to identify and correct (if possible) any problems during data entry. As part of the process, WYSAC conducted quality control checks of more than 2% of surveys returned. When a questionnaire was randomly selected for a quality control check, quality control specialists hand-checked data on the questionnaire against the data residing in the scanning database. These quality control checks indicated a better than 99.9% accuracy rate.

After all survey booklets were scanned, the data were cleaned using multiple criteria. First, the Oregon Health Authority provided methods to test for dubious and discrepant responses based on a large set of cross-referenced questions. Questionnaires judged invalid through this process were removed from the dataset. Second, for a questionnaire to be considered valid it had to have a least 20 questions answered. Third, because reports are divided by grade (8th and 11th) a valid grade had to be selected by the respondent or back-filled logically using age and school type. Last, a new honesty question was added to the survey in 2011 which asked students how honest they were while filling out the questionnaire. Any student answering *not honest at all* or *honest once in a while* was considered invalid. However, after all other cleaning criteria had been applied no additional surveys were disqualified due to the honesty question.

To maintain confidentiality of students, data from any grade with less than 15 respondents in a given school or district are not reported.

Respondents who did not indicate their grade in school had their grade back-filled, if possible, based on a combination of their age and the version (8th or 11th) of the survey they completed. Additionally, for any respondent who did not indicate at least one choice on a “mark all that apply” question, all of that question’s response choices were set as missing (rather than a non-response).

State level analysis was conducted using Complex Samples module for SPSS 19.0 to accommodate the clustered sampling (one-stage cluster for high schools, two-stage cluster for middle schools). Pearson-Chi Square significance tests were conducted between gender for 8th and 11th grades for the state sample.

2.6. Weighting

Completed surveys from schools that were part of the statewide random sample were weighted. In order to calculate the final weight values, four factors were considered: the base weight for the probability of a particular school being selected, an adjustment for school and student response rates, an adjustment for replacement schools to account for differences in size between the school originally selected and its replacement, and an adjustment for county non-coverage.

2.7. Survey Limitations and Considerations

The OHT is a self-report questionnaire that students complete voluntarily and anonymously. But inherent in self-report survey results are important limitations and considerations. A variety of factors may affect the accuracy of the survey responses. For instance, respondent dishonesty has the potential to bias results. In some cases, the dishonesty is motivated by respondents giving socially desirable answers rather than answers that accurately reflect their behaviors. In other cases, students exaggerate their participation in substance use and problem behaviors. Administering the surveys anonymously helps mitigate both types of dishonesty by providing a screen or buffer that encourages more open and honest responses. But in addition, the OHT has several dubious/discrepant checks that help detect when students may be persistently answering inaccurately or inconsistently (discussed in Section 2.5.)

Other self-report limitations that can influence how students answer questions include: (1) the student's ability to remember the events and behaviors that the questionnaire asks about, (2) the student's interpretation of what the question is asking, and (3) how applicable the student feels the question is in his/her life. An example in which each of these limitations may play a part is the question asking, "How old were you when you first had more than a sip or two of beer, wine, or hard liquor (for example, vodka, whiskey, or gin)?" Memory limitations may play a role because the more time that has passed since the student first used alcohol, the more difficult it may be for him/her to recall the exact age of first use. In addition, students who have never used alcohol may not answer the question, even though "never have" is an option, because they do not feel that it is applicable to them. Finally, the interpretation of "more than a sip or two" could vary substantially from 8th grade students, who might interpret that phrase much more conservatively than the 11th grade students, for whom a sip might be thought of as substantially more.

School survey administrators were instructed to allow students at least 45 minutes to complete the survey. Based on previous administrations, most students easily complete the survey within those 45 minutes; however, some students require more time to finish the questionnaire, and therefore some students may not have answered as completely as possible.

The OHT, like all self-report surveys, contains a degree of error and misreporting, but acknowledged scientific methods were rigorously employed to detect and minimize inaccurate and dishonest reporting.

2.7.1. Survey Modality

For the first time, schools and school districts were offered the choice to administer the survey over the internet using an online questionnaire or rather than use the traditional paper-and-pencil questionnaire. The research literature suggests that the results from online surveys typically do not differ substantially from paper-based surveys (Denniston et al., 2010; Eaton et al., 2010; Bates & Cox, 2008; Lucia, Hermann & Killias, 2007; Denscombe, 2006; Vereecken & Maes, 2006; McCabe et al., 2005; Mangunkusumo et al., 2005; Wang, et al., 2005). These studies found very few differences in results based on whether the survey was online or paper based. The few differences encountered were inconsistent even within the same survey. Overall, the research suggests that the two different modes have at most a modest effect on survey results when administered in the school context.

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3. Results – 11th Grade

Presented in this section are expanded results from specific questions selected by the Oregon Health Authority. These questions cover multiple topics: substance use, physical health, suicide, and sexual behavior. Complete survey results for Brookings-Harbor SD 17C and corresponding weighted Oregon percentages can be found in Appendix A. For state-level unweighted counts refer to the State profile report. In general, 104 different schools returned 11,530 valid OHT surveys. The online survey was used by one-fifth (20%) of all respondents, but one-fourth (26%) of all participating schools.

3.1. Survey Participants and Demographics (11th)

Demographic breakdowns of all Brookings-Harbor SD 17C students are shown below in Figure 1. *The bars to the right of the table represent Brookings-Harbor SD 17C percentages.*

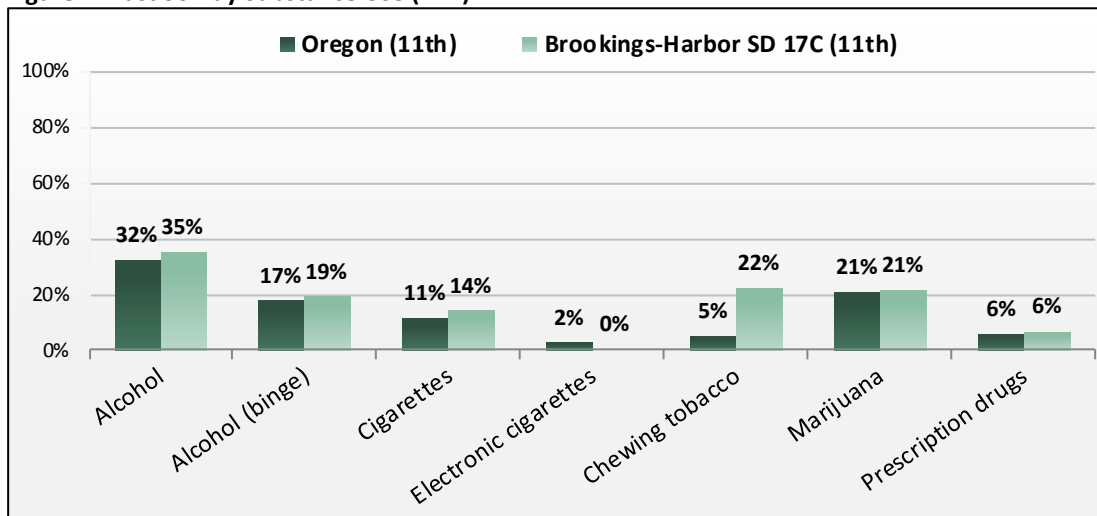
3.2. Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drug Use (11th)

Alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use data from the OHT are highlighted in this section. Smoking is the number one preventable cause of disease and death in this country. Most adult smokers start smoking before the age of 18⁷. Alcohol is the country's most widely used legal drug and, despite the fact it is illegal for 8th and 11th graders to purchase alcohol, its use is widespread in teens as well. The American Medical Association⁸ warns that damage to youth from alcohol can be irreversible.

3.2.1. Past 30 Day Use (11th)

Students were asked about their use of multiple substances within the past 30 days. Percentages indicating usage are shown below. The binge drinking category is defined as five or more drinks within 2 hours, and the prescription drug category refers to non-medical use of any prescription-only drugs.

3.2.2. Reported Use vs. Perceived Use (11th)

Numerous studies have identified a pattern regarding how adolescents, young adults, and older adults perceive how often *other people* they encounter participate in substance use and various problem behaviors. Students often demonstrate a tendency to report that most other students in their school are using substances, but that they themselves are not, or are using at much lower rates than their peers. This gap between the actual reported substance use rate and the perceived substance use rate forms the basis of social norms theory (Agonstinelli, Brown & Miller, 1995; Haines, 1996; Linkenbach, 1999). Based on social norms theory, the perception of how often and to what extent other students are using drugs and alcohol can be a critical factor in whether a student decides to use drugs and alcohol.

The OHT asked students about their perception of their peers' substance use:

- “What percentage of youth in your grade do you think smoked cigarettes in the past 30 days?”
- “What percentage of youth in your grade do you think used smokeless tobacco in the past 30 days?”
- “What percentage of youth in your grade do you think smoked tobacco in a hookah in the past 30 days?”

The results of these three questions are presented with student self-reported use of the corresponding substance, in Brookings-Harbor SD 17C and in the statewide sample. These percentages demonstrate if there is a gap between reported usage of cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, and hookahs and the perceived usage.

Figure 3. Reported and Perceived Substance Use (Cigarettes) (11th)

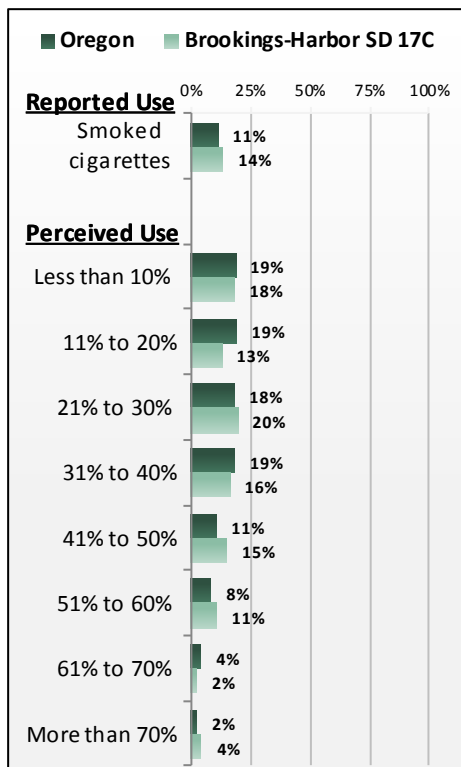


Figure 4. Reported and Perceived Substance Use (Smokeless Tobacco) (11th)

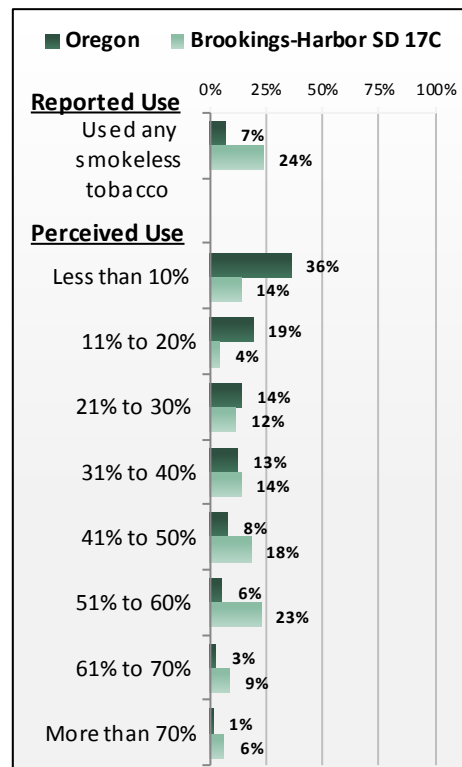
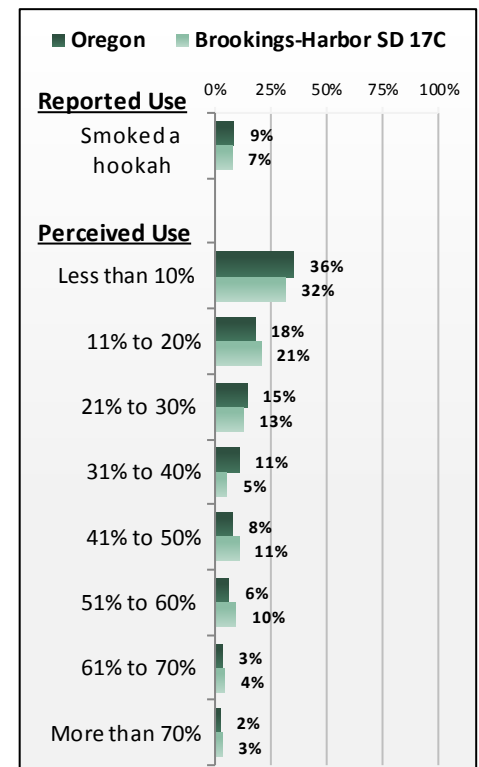


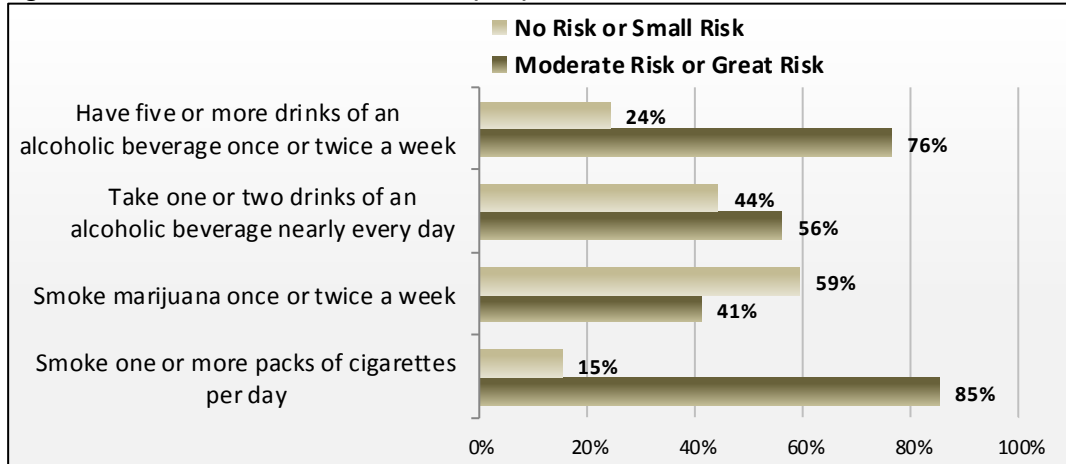
Figure 5. Reported and Perceived Substance Use (Hookah) (11th)



3.2.3. Perception of Risk (11th)

The student’s own attitudes and beliefs about risky behaviors are important predictors of whether or not a student will engage in inappropriate or dangerous behavior. Students were asked how much people risk harming themselves (no risk, slight risk, moderate risk, or great risk) from usage of different substances in specific quantities over defined time periods (e.g., having five or more drinks of an alcoholic beverage once or twice a week). The data displayed below contains only Brookings-Harbor SD 17C responses.

Figure 6. Perceived Risk of Substance Use (11th)

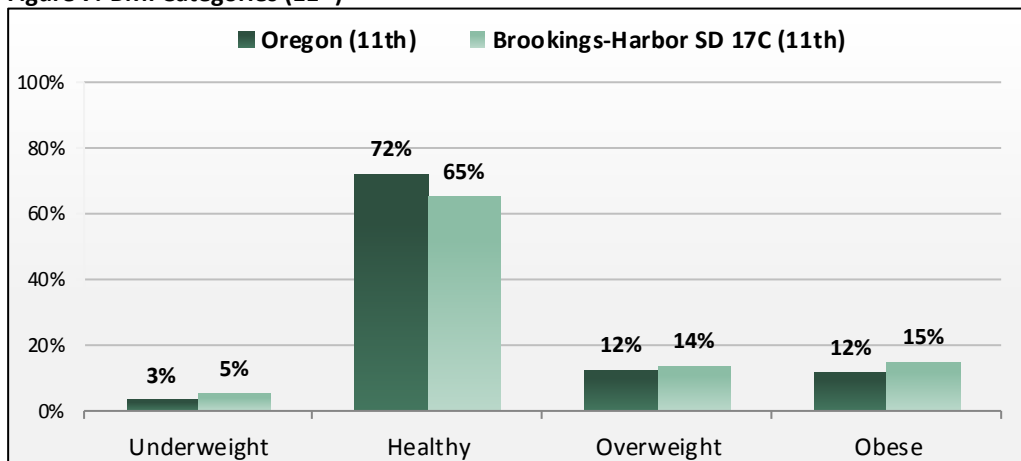


3.3. Physical Health: BMI, Physical Activity, and Nutrition (11th)

3.3.1. Body Mass Index (BMI) (11th)

The body mass index is defined as an individual's body weight divided by the square of his or her height. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has released a data file containing BMI percentiles split by age and gender.⁹ BMI categories can be created from these percentiles: Underweight (1st - 5th percentile), Healthy (6th - 84th percentile), Overweight (85th - 95th percentile) and Obese (96th - 100th percentile). Respondent data broken into these categories is displayed below for Brookings-Harbor SD 17C and the Oregon statewide sample.

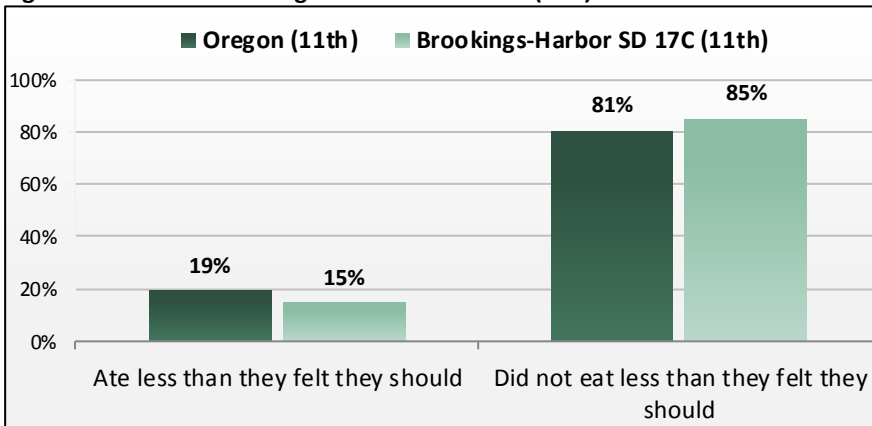
Figure 7. BMI Categories (11th)

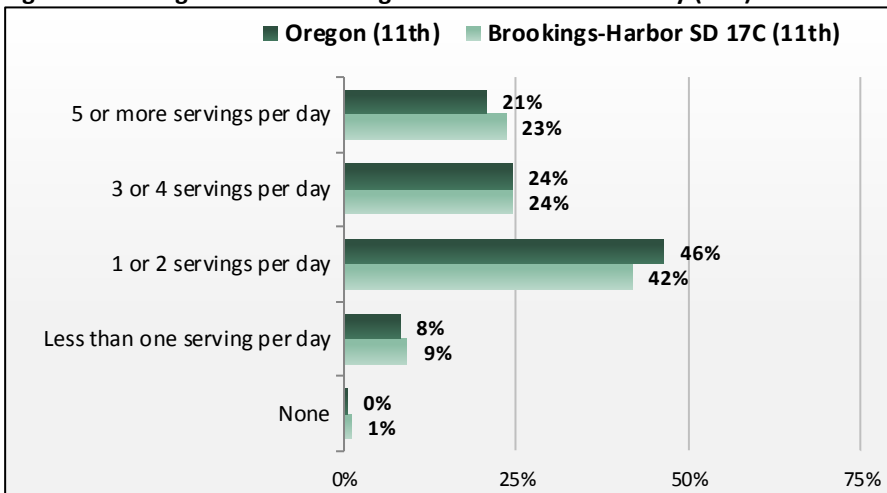
Figure 8 presents comparative results on whether students believed they had enough to eat in the past 12 months.

Figure 8. Did Not Eat Enough in Past 12 Months (11th)



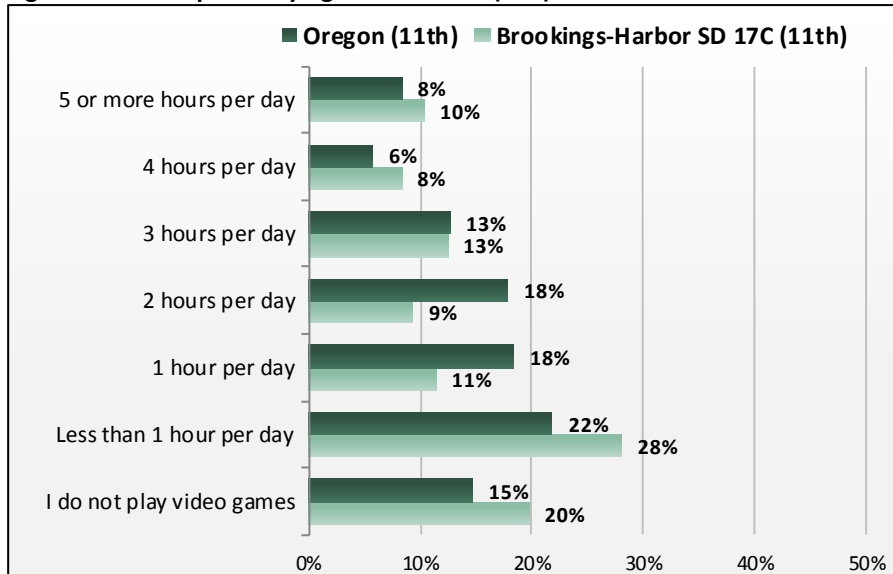
Students reported the number of servings of fruits and vegetables eaten per day in Figure 9. These percentages are calculated from multiple of questions about consumption of fruit juice, fruit, and vegetables.

Figure 9. Servings of Fruits and Vegetables Consumed Per Day (11th)



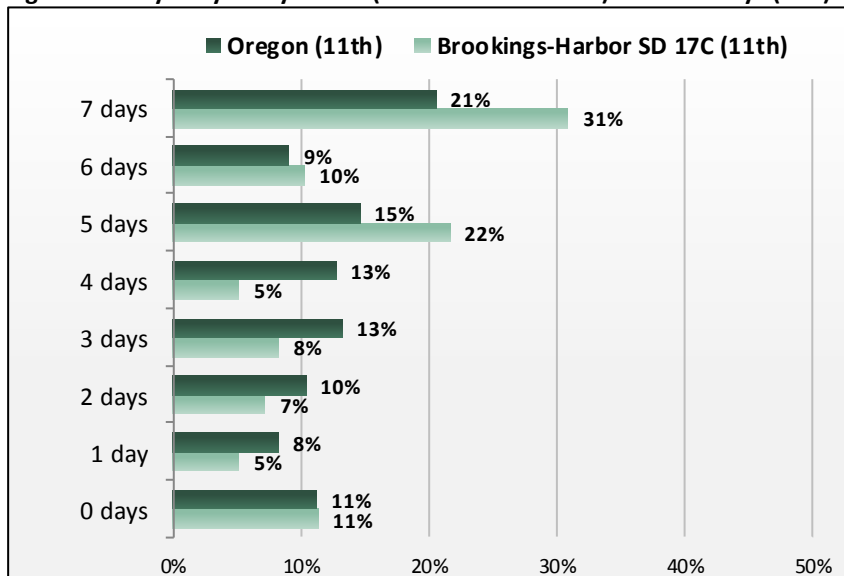
Shown in Figure 10 below is the amount of time students spent per day playing video games. This includes games played on a computer, console (e.g., Xbox, Wii, Playstation) or handheld (DS, iPod).

The Surgeon General recommends that children should engage in 60 minutes of moderate physical activity per day. Physical activity among adolescents is consistently related to higher levels of academic performance and self-esteem and lower levels of anxiety and stress. Figure 11 shows the number of days, in the last seven, students reported engaging in physical activity of 60 minutes or more.¹⁰

Figure 11. Days Physically Active (60 Minutes or More) in Last 7 Days (11th)

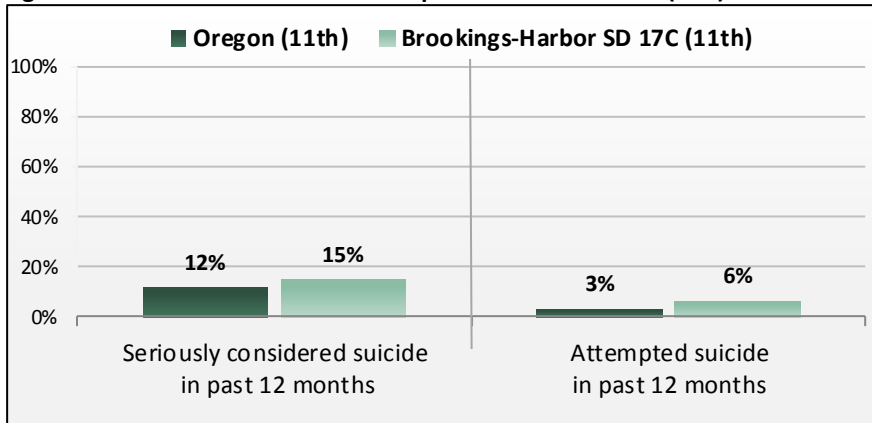

3.4. Suicide and Injury Prevention (11th)

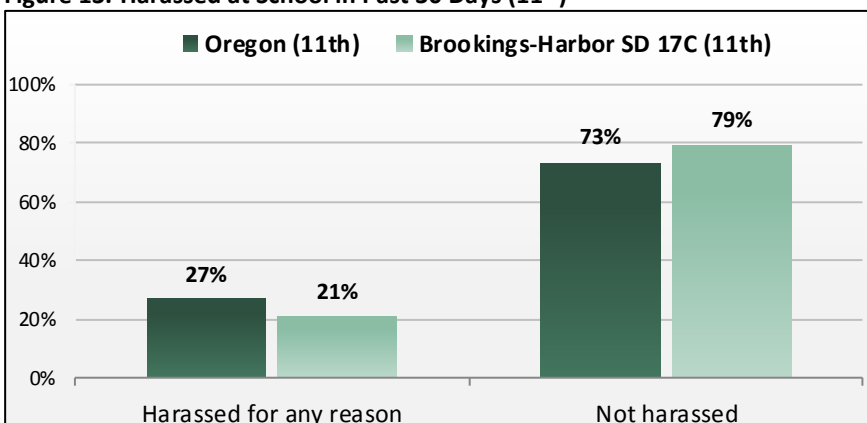
Figure 12. Suicide Ideation and Attempts in Past 12 Months (11th)

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) defines suicidal ideation as thinking about, considering, or planning suicide. Suicide ideation itself does not necessarily mean that a person is at imminent risk of harming themselves, but can be a symptom of major depression. The CDC defines a suicide attempt as a *non-fatal self-directed potentially injurious behavior with any intent to die as a result of the behavior*. A suicide attempt may or may not result in injury. Figure 12 presents the results of both suicide ideation and suicide attempts reported by students.¹¹

Shown in Figure 14 to the mark-all-that-apply question: During the past 30 days, have you ever been harassed at school (or on the way to or from school) in relation to any of the following issues? The individual issues included as responses were aggregated into the category “Harassed for any reason.”

Researchers from the National Center for School Engagement conducted a quantitative study to examine the impact of bullying on student engagement, attendance, and achievement and two qualitative studies to explore instructional, interpersonal, and structural factors at school that affect the connection between bullying and school attendance. The researchers found that a caring school community, in which students are challenged academically and supported by the adults, can serve as a counter to the process by which victimization distances students from learning and contributes to other problems, including truancy and academic failure.¹²

Figure 13. Harassed at School in Past 30 Days (11th)

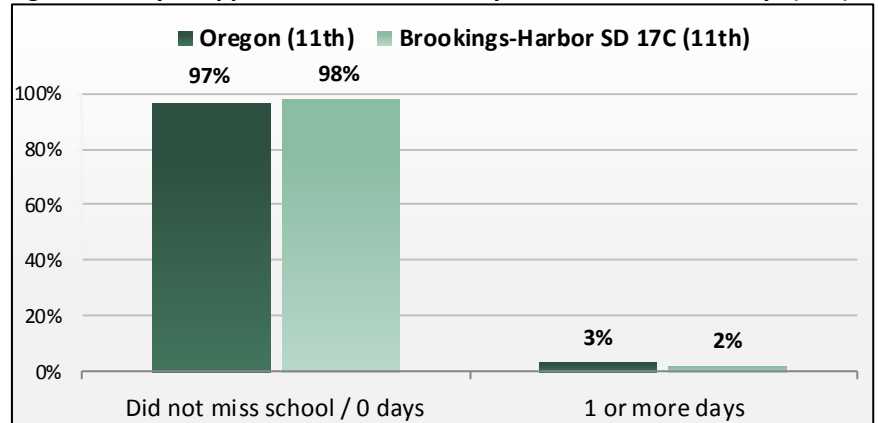

Figure 14. Days Skipped School due to Safety Concerns in Past 30 Days (11th)

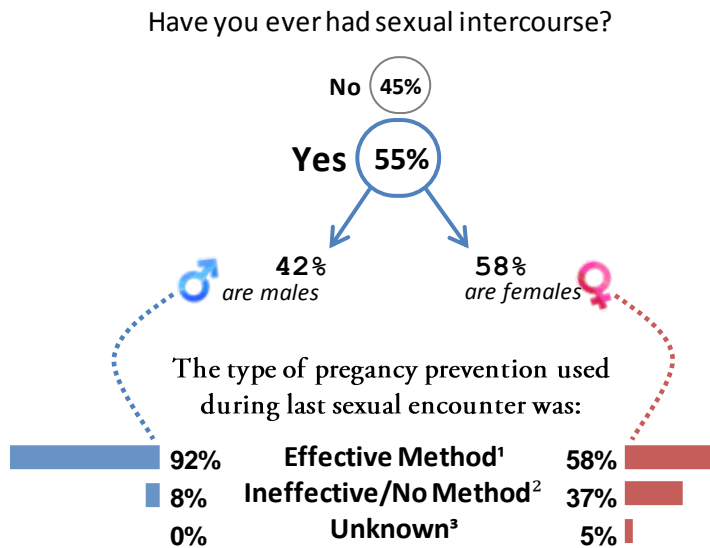


3.5. Sexual Behavior (11th)

Adolescents who engage in sexual intercourse are at increased risk for a number of health, social and economic consequences. Unprotected sex and multiple sex partners place young people at risk for HIV infection, other sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), and pregnancy. Each year, there are approximately 15 million new STD cases in the United States, and about one-fourth of these are among teenagers. Despite a decline in the last two decades, teen pregnancy rates in the U.S. remain among the highest in the industrialized world (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 2009). Youth who have sex at a young age are also at higher risk for depression, dropping out of school, and other risky behaviors.

The graphic below presents the results from two questions: 1) had sexual intercourse¹³ and 2) the type of birth control used, if any¹⁴. Of those who indicated they have had sexual intercourse, results are disaggregated by gender.

3.6. Positive Youth Development (11th)

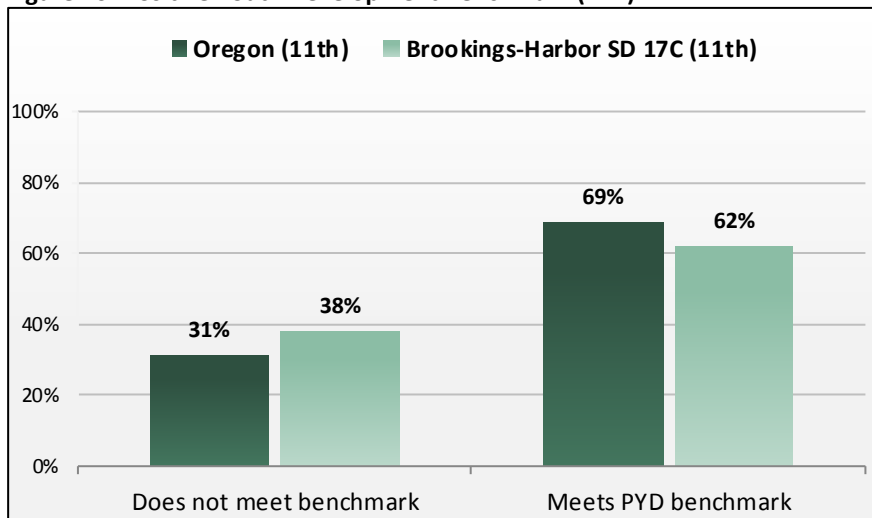
There is a strong, well-established link between health and learning. Students' health impacts attendance, test scores, and the ability to pay attention in class. Emotional, social and physical health problems can become barriers to learning, making it difficult for students to be academically or behaviorally successful in school.

Positive Youth Development (PYD) is a term used to describe empowering and promoting youths' confidence, competence, and resilience in ways that benefit both youth and the larger society. PYD Theory recognizes that all youth have a vital stake in their future and a pivotal role to play in working alongside adults to shape policies that affect them. Supporting PYD often requires a shift from viewing adolescents as troublemakers who exhibit risky behavior to seeing youth as positive change agents, willing and able to contribute to society. PYD focuses on viewing youth as partners with providers, policy makers, and researchers and on developing their skills for meaningful participation.

The PYD benchmark that is reported is calculated based on responses to six questions in the survey related to well-being and social connectedness: physical health status, mental health status, volunteerism, having a supportive adult, self-confidence and problem-solving. The PYD provides a measure of the number of teens reporting strong levels of individual health and confidence, adult support at school and helping others in the community.
