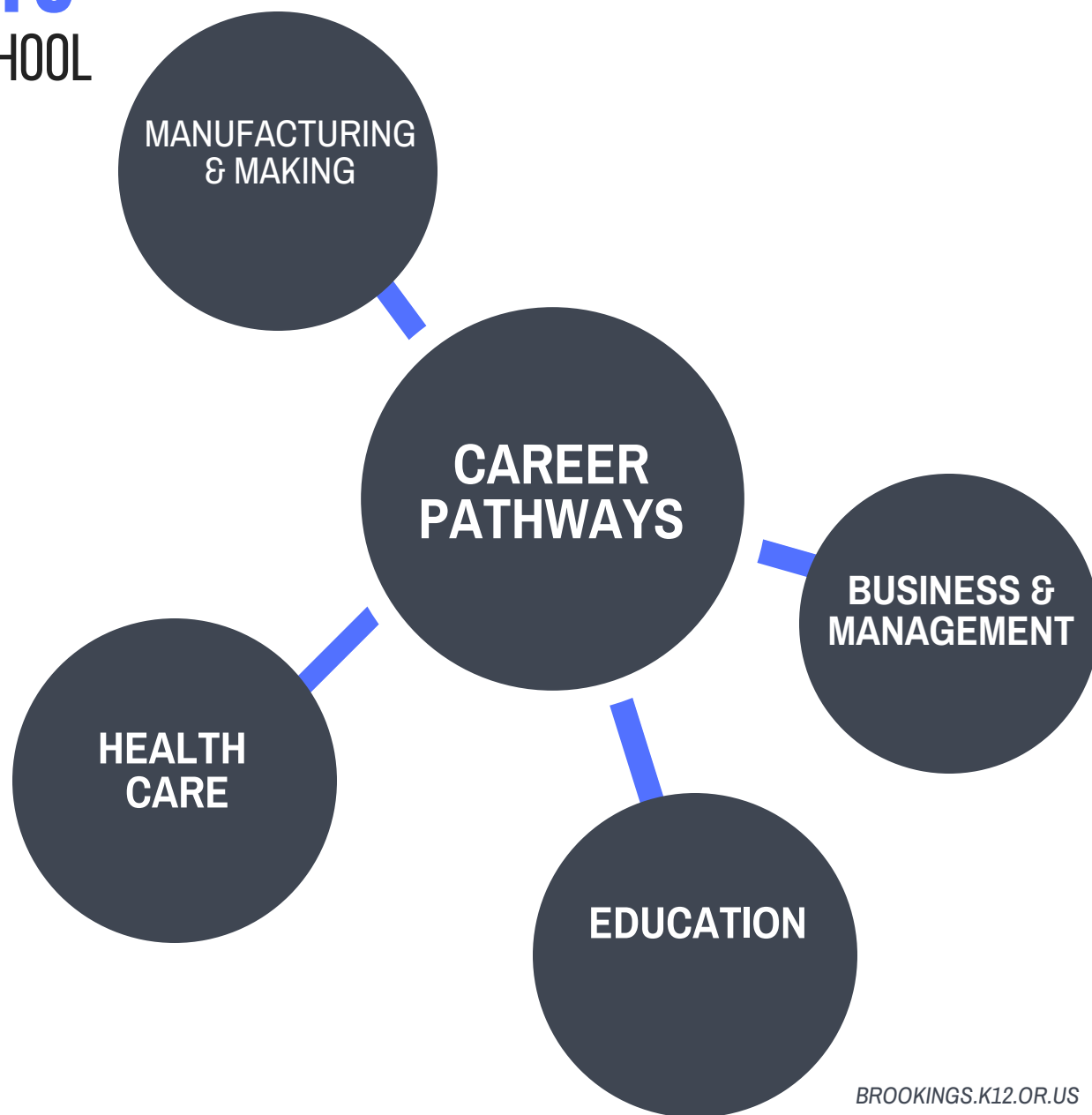
BROOKINGS-HARBOR HIGH SCHOOL

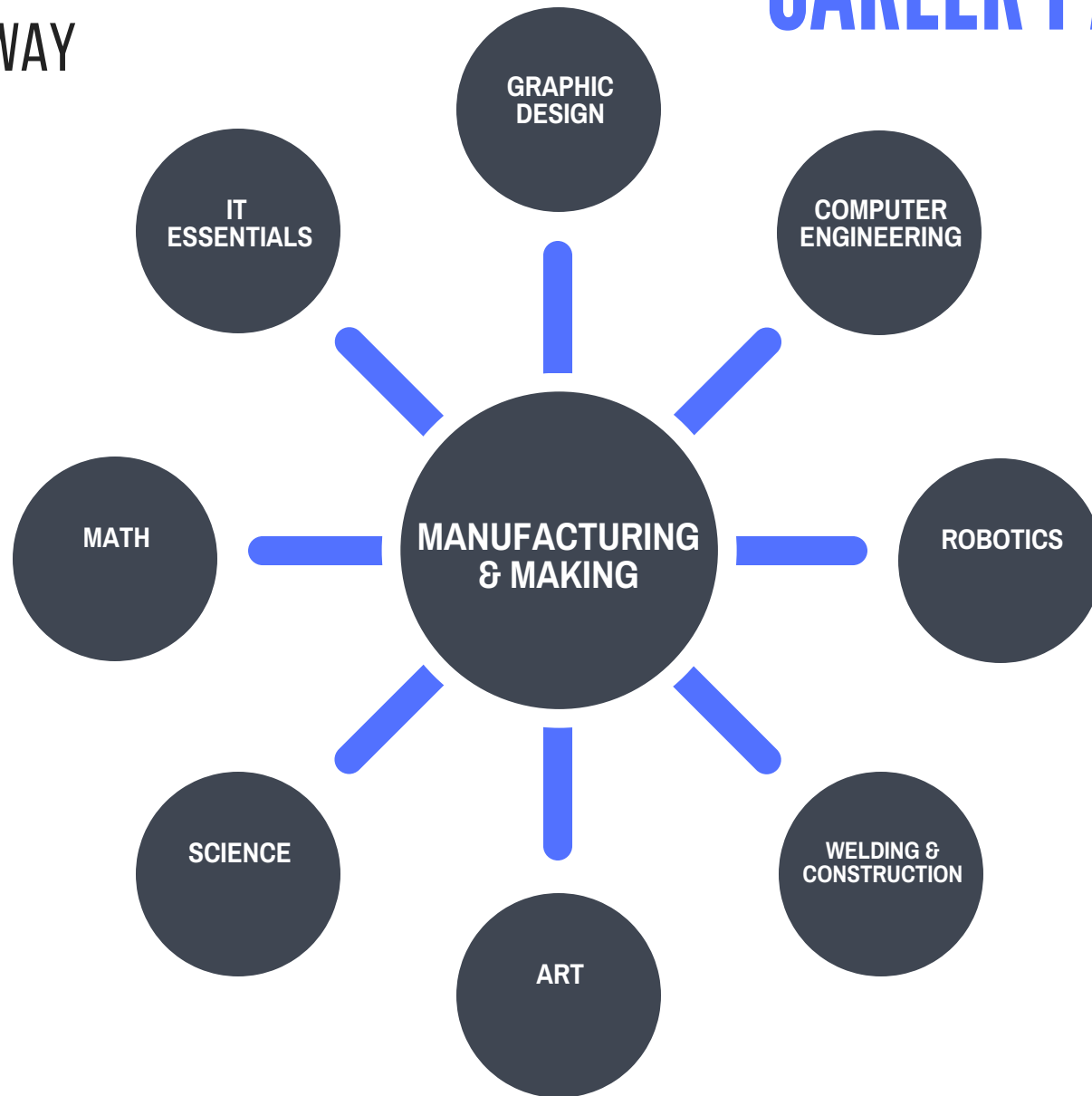

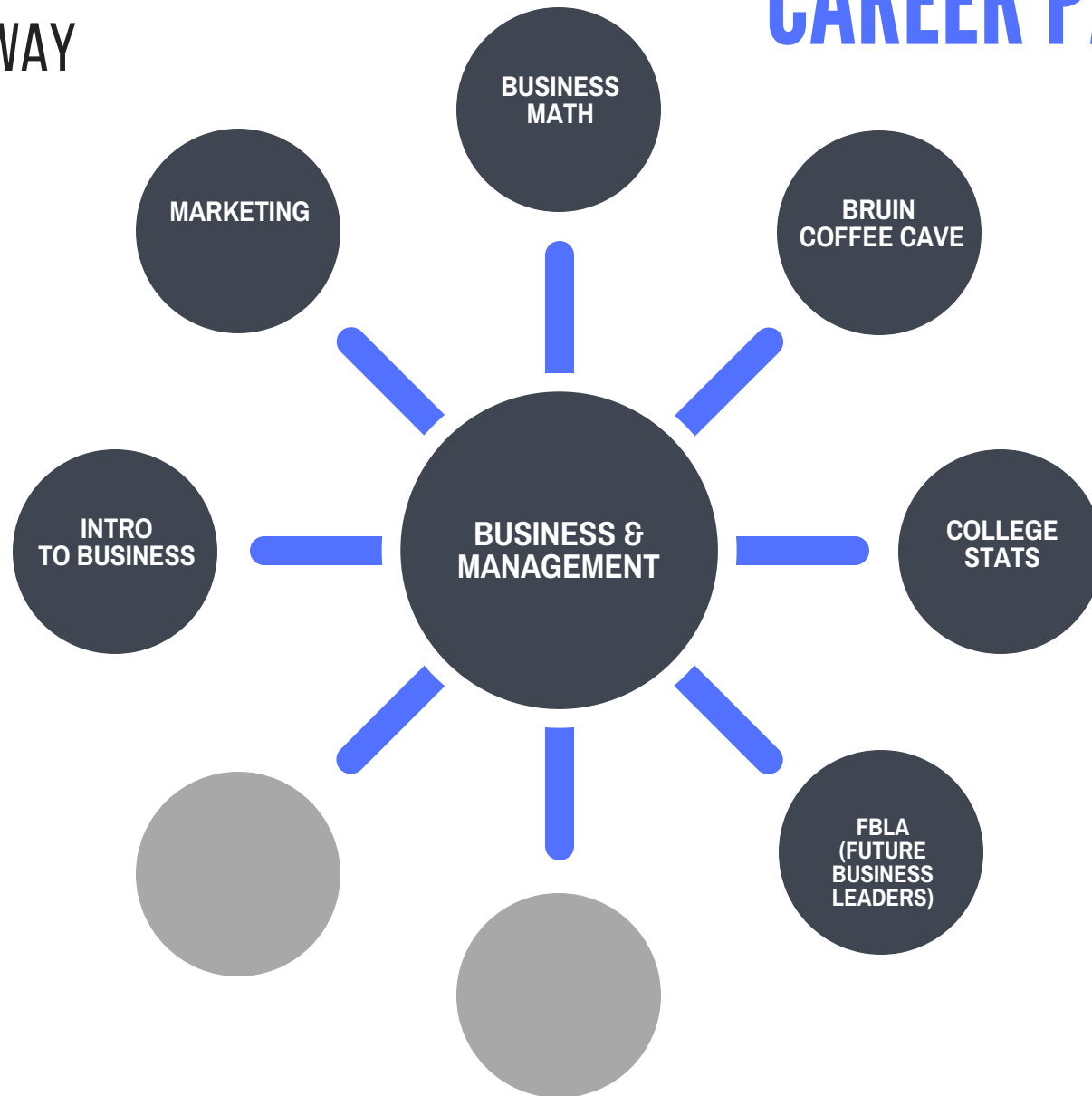

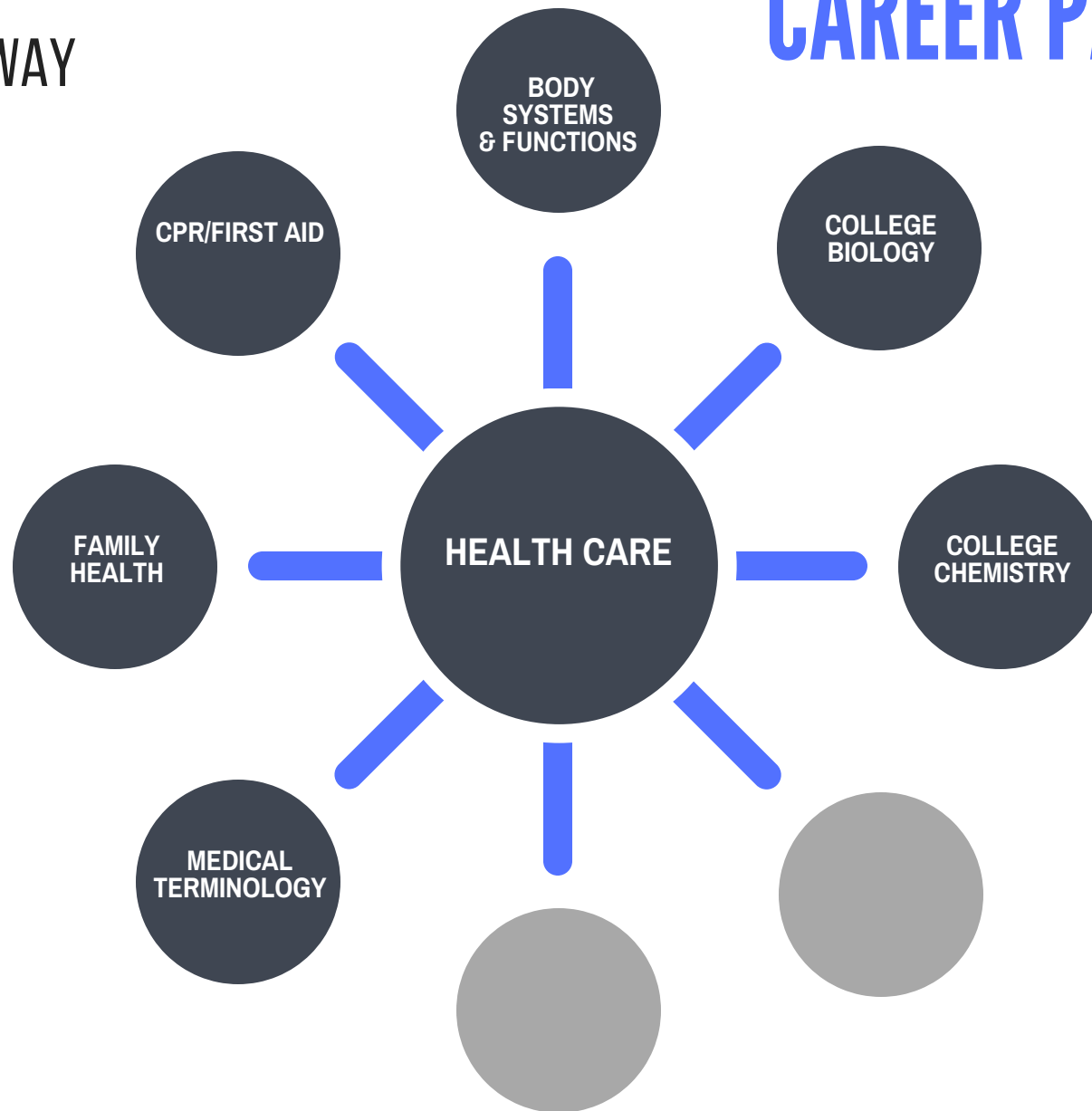
